70 years Universal Declaration of Human Rights – A time for concern or celebration?

Berlin, 15-16 October 2018 Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung, Hiroshimastr. 17, 10785 Berlin

The Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) is a milestone document in the history of human rights. Drafted by representatives with a variety of legal and cultural backgrounds from all regions of the world, the Declaration was adopted by the United Nations General Assembly on 10 December 1948 in Paris. The Declaration continues to serve as a common standard of achievements for all peoples and all nations to this day.

To celebrate the 70th anniversary of the adoption of the Declaration, the German Institute for Human Rights, Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung, Forum Menschenrechte and the Geneva Academy for International Humanitarian Law and Human Rights invite you to a discussion on the significance and impact of the Declaration today. How relevant is the UDHR in times that see the rise in both horizontal and vertical inequality as well as increasing political instability? How has the international human rights landscape, as well as concrete human rights priorities changed? Is the scope of international human rights law still adequate to challenges in the 21st century? And to what extent can current international human rights instruments be utilized to achieve some of the standards outlined in the Declaration?

In deliberating these questions, we would like to focus on concrete experience. To this end, the discussions will address practical experiences encountered as well as persistent weaknesses of the UN System. In-depth discussions of thematic segments will analyse key issues while discussing the broad spectrum of existing and emerging rights.

One thematic pillar of the expert meeting will be Article 3 of the UDHR - the Right to Life - which is currently a hotly debated topic. The enjoyment of human rights in situations of war or armed conflict, of countering terrorism, of excessive use of force by law enforcement agents as well as the compatibility of human rights with arms exports will be a key element of the discussions. The meeting will address the normative scope of human rights and the necessary cooperation with international humanitarian law. By combining a humanitarian and human rights approach to sustaining peace, conflict situations might be addressed more effectively as well as more easily prevented in the first place. The public event on Monday evening will address challenges for human rights defenders across the globe in strengthening human rights standards, both in the context of policy making and public discourse. The second day of the expert meeting will focus on economic, social and cultural rights which continue to find themselves neglected in the international discourse. The universal, indivisible and interrelated nature of human will be highlighted as well as the opportunity provided by human rights, and the UDHR in particular.
